I am writing this letter and reaching out to all the parents in light of the very sad and frightening tragedy that has unfolded in Parkland, Florida. Our hearts and prayers go out to all the families, teachers, and students of Stoneman Douglas High School. Our hearts and prayers go out to all those who did not return from that school tonight and to all the families and friends related to the Parkland community. There are no words that capture what so many are feeling right now.

We want to reassure all the parents that we take the safety of our children seriously. We have asked the teachers to be extra alert. We ask parents to NOT extend the courtesy of holding doors open or letting anyone that they do not know, through a locked door, into our schools.

I am contacting all directors to offer dialogue among our teachers and reviewing developmentally appropriate conversation structures for our children. We do not intend to have any discussions with the children but will be prepared if a child begins to ask questions. We are working on our response and we will contact the parent to inform that their child is questioning the situation. We will also review our emergency plans for each school as we do on a regular schedule. We want all the students to feel safe in our schools. We want all the parents to be confident that we do provide safe schools.
